Born in Tokyo, Kiichiro Hagino studied architectural design at University of Tokyo and University of Pennsylvania. Having experience of practicing and teaching in Japan and in the United States, he moved to a rural village at Noto Peninsula in 2004. As an architect, he has worked restoration / renovation projects as well as new construction, including restoration of dozo after the Noto earthquake in 2007. As for teaching, he has taught design studio projects including design/build projects, at many schools, such as Meiji University, Kanazawa College of Arts and Ecole nationale supérieure d'architecture de Nancy. He is now doing a research on method of education in architectural design making use of real scaled design/build projects. Living in rural village, he is working on various activities for rediscovering, preserving and introducing Satoyama lifestyle.
